- 2) HOPE becomes the voice by which God inspires us with revelation and vision
- 3) HOPE working in us brings us to freedom, joy, stability, safety and continuity
- 4) Examples of HOPE developed in adversity: Abraham (Rom. 4:18) Martha and Mary (Jn.11) Road to Emmaus(Luke 24) Jacob (Gen. 28)

V. Purpose and Importance of HOPE (Power and Dynamics)

- 1) Gives clarity, focus, energizing the vision
- 2) Motivates us to move forward with positive expectation for the future
- 3) Empowers our confidence, commitment and comfort
- 4) Releases joy, renewal and readiness
- 5) Imparts flexibility and creativity to discover new possibilities
- 6) Helps us persevere and cope with difficulties and uncertainties
- 7) Gives us assurance, freedom, affirmation and stability
- 8) Enhances communication, unity and cooperation (bringing people together)
- 9) Produces courage to create an environment for progress and success
- 10) Inspires alignment and engagement
- 11) Brings transformation and increase in holiness and watchfulness

VI. Igniting and Imparting HOPE to Others

- 1) Recognizing our true identity prepares us to give HOPE to others (Col.1:27; 1Pet. 3:15)
- 2) Being available, transparent, and tender
- 3) Recognizing reality but declaring the promises of God
- 4) Communicating in a way that gives assurance and security
- 5) Directing people to the source of HOPE while focusing on vision
- 6) Helping others to distinguish between true and false HOPE
- Inspiring and encouraging others to exercise their faith by declaring the promises of God
- 8) Communicating to people their value and God's call and plan for their lives (Ezekiel 37)
